### Sendai 3/11 Memorial Community Center

The Sendai 3/11 Memorial Community Center is a place where the wisdom and lessons learned are passed on to the future and the world through people's memories and experiences. In addition to learning about the damage from the earthquake, participants can observe activities such as displays and workshops through which people pass on their thoughts and feelings to future generations.

## Ruins of the Great East Japan Earthquake: Sendai Arahama Elementary School

: Transfer form Sendai International Center to venues

Arahama Elementary School is where tsunamis came up to the second floor as children, faculty, and neighborhood residents evacuated to the roof top during the Great East Japan Earthquake. The building has been preserved and the scars of the tsunami can be seen in the interior. The threat of tsunamis can be seen through the videos and photos, etc. that are on display.

#### Nakano 5-chome Tsunami evacuation tower

In areas which may be flooded by a tsunami, we are constructing 13 evacuation facilities in total including six towers, and five buildings with fire station, and two sets of outdoor evacuation stairs for existing elementary and junior high schools.

The evacuation tower at Nakano 5-chome is a two-story steel framed structure over six meters above ground, allowing 300 people to evacuate at any given time.

## Ruins of the Great East Japan Earthquake: Residential Foundation

Ruins of the Great East Japan Earthquake: Residential Foundation is a preserved part of residential foundation in the Arahama area of Sendai where most of houses were washed away by the Tsunami which followed after the Great East Japan Earthquake. This plays an important role not only to pass on the threat of Tsunami and the memories of the disaster, but also to communicate the lives of those who resided in the area. In the vicinity you can view the Arahama Remembrance Bell, a monument to remember those who passed away in the tsunami, and the geographical features which remained after the tsunami inundation.
